

Breakers continue to make waves

This may be its inaugural season in the Bay Counties League Central Division, but the Bay girls' basketball team is certainly exhibiting no signs of freshman trepidation.

The Breakers continued to surprise Monday, defeating host Waldorf 45-39 behind a balanced scoring offense and a suffocating defense. Bay improved to 9-8 overall and 3-2 in the BCL Central.

Maylin Khuu and Kelly Wyatt each scored nine points for Bay and three other players scored at least seven as the Breakers pulled away in the second half for the win.

Waldorf (3-7, 2-3) led 18-16 at the half, but Bay outscored the Wolverines 15-9 to take a 31-25 lead after three quarters, then opened the fourth on 7-2 run to go ahead 40-31 with under three minutes to play.

"It's our first year and we're trying to build a winning tradition," Bay coach Larry Minnich said. "We played with effort tonight, and any time we do that I've got to be happy."
